Job Responsibilities:

The main duties involve providing individual counseling for children, teens, and adults.

- Provide grief and trauma-informed clinical mental health services that are eligible for reimbursement by public and private insurance.
- Schedule intake meetings for assigned client(s) and/or support group registrants who intend to use Cornerstone of Hope services.
- Select the best approach to use in individual therapy such as directive, nondirective, and supportive therapy, and devise treatment plans to include frequency, intensity, and duration of therapy.
- Complete charts, treatment plans, discharge summaries, progress notes, assessments, and other chart-related documents and correspondences for assigned clients in a timely manner and according to organizational policy.
- Seek clinical consultation with clinical team members as necessary.
- Provide referrals for individuals who need more specialized care, working with other community resources and referral sources to coordinate services for such clients.
- Provide therapeutic crisis intervention and emergency services as needed and/or available.
- Adhere to confidentiality laws and procedures at all times.
- Promote Cornerstone of Hope and its mission to local communities, businesses, funeral homes, churches, schools, senior centers, etc.
- Perform miscellaneous and/or other job-related duties as needed.
